
Fortis Escorts Hospital, Faridabad, installs Vacuum Swing Adsorption Oxygen Generating Plant

Clinical Excellence

34-yr-old patient's inability to swallow food cured after incisionless endoscopic surgery at Fortis Escorts, Okhla Road



The Gastroenterology & Hepatobiliary Sciences Team at Fortis Escorts Liver & Digestive Diseases Institute, Okhla Road, New Delhi



A team led by Dr Pankaj Puri, Director - Gastroenterology & Hepatobiliary Sciences, Fortis Escorts Liver & Digestive Diseases Institute, New Delhi, performed the incisionless Peroral Endoscopic Myotomy (POEM) procedure to treat a 34-year-old male patient's inability to swallow food or water. Very few centres in Delhi NCR have the capability to perform the procedure.

The patient had arrived with complaints of difficulty in swallowing, chest pain and weight loss. For over a year-and-a-half, food and water would get stuck in his chest and he would regurgitate. Oesophageal manometry, a diagnostic test, revealed that his food pipe (oesophagus) showed features

suggestive of Achalasia Cardia, a rare motility disorder that impairs oesophageal peristalsis (contraction and relaxation of oesophageal muscles enabling movement of ingested food). The doctors also found that the patient's lower oesophageal sphincter (a muscular ring that controls the passage of food from the food pipe to the stomach) does not relax during swallowing. POEM, a corrective procedure for Achalasia patients, helped the patient recover swiftly. "He is presently symptom free and is doing well. He has also has gained 2 kgs of weight," said Dr Puri.

2-year-old child with rare brain disease cured after month-long treatment at Fortis Anandapur, Kolkata



A two-year-old baby with a history of cough and cold viral fever was admitted to the emergency department of Fortis Hospital, Anandapur, Kolkata, after he started experiencing lethargy and prolonged convulsion. The situation got worse over time and baby was having gasping breathing and oxygen level in blood was almost 60% at admission. A team of doctors had to ventilate the baby. MRI scan of the brain showed that the white matter of brain had diffuse changes and brain had swollen up.

The baby needed ventilation support as well as support to keep blood pressure steady for almost seven days. When the baby woke up, his brain was like a two month old baby who does not have any neck control and was unable to swallow food. After a month of expert support and physiotherapy, the baby learned to swallow food and was able to stand. Dr Sumita Saha, Consultant, Paediatrics, said, "When he was discharged, he was just able to swallow food but not able to sit by himself. However, now that it's been three months, he is able to walk

and talk like a happy little child. This condition is called ADEM or acute disseminated encephalomyelitis. He had bleeding areas in the brain which made ADEM more severe and complicated. This disease is autoimmune disease triggered by influenza B virus, which we were able to isolate from his respiratory secretion."

Tuberculosis patient who went into heart failure, treated at Fortis Escorts, Okhla, New Delhi

Doctors at Fortis Escorts Heart Institute (FEHI), Okhla, New Delhi, successfully treated a 51-year-old female patient for Fulminant Myocarditis. The patient had presented with symptoms of intractable Heart Failure and inotrope dependence during course of hospitalisation. An echo and clinical examination indicated Cardiac Tamponade with Severe Biventricular dysfunction. Urgently pericardial aspiration was done, patient started recuperating. Pericardial aspirate was done which revealed she was also suffering from tuberculosis. Cardiac MRI also confirmed it. Tuberculosis leading to myocarditis is a rare entity. She was started on anti-tubercular therapy.

But newer challenge came patient started having incessant ventricular tachyarrhythmia. She had cardiac arrest four times in course of a week. Cardiac massage was done and shock given for patient to revive. She was successfully resuscitated without any ventilator support. After discussion with relatives ICD was implanted. Currently the patient is stable and recuperating at home. A team of doctors led by Dr Vivudh Pratap Singh, Consultant, Interventional Cardiology, FEHI, handled the



case. He said, "We think tuberculosis is a common disease with fever as the only manifestation, but in our country, where it is still prevalent, its effects on heart are sometimes missed. With timely diagnosis and correct therapy even, this can be managed. It required multi-disciplinary coordination and sustained efforts to bail out the patient"



104-year-old female undergoes hip replacement at Fortis Noida, walks the very next day

A 104-year-old female, who had a hip fracture after a fall, underwent a successful hip replacement surgery at Fortis Hospital, Noida. The surgery was done by a team led by Dr Brajesh Koushle, Additional Director – Orthopaedics, on December 21, 2021. The patient commenced walking the very next day and was discharged on December 23, 2021.

Premature baby weighing 465 grams and on ventilator support gets new lease of life at Fortis Mohali

Dr Sunil Kumar Agrawal, Senior Consultant and Head - Neonatology, Fortis Hospital, Mohali, gave a new lease of life to a premature baby boy born three-and-half-months early and weighing 465 grams. The infant was on ventilation for three months and recovered without administration of antibiotics. The baby was born at 25 weeks of gestation due to severe Preeclampsia in the mother at Fortis Mohali on August 14, 2021. The infant had severe breathing problems and was on invasive ventilation for nearly 28 days, followed by Continuous Positive Airway Pressure – a gentle form of ventilation for treatment of premature babies – for another 42 days. The baby also faced prematurity-related complications such as neonatal jaundice, feeding intolerance, osteopenia of prematurity, hyponatremia, periventricular leukomalacia and retinopathy of prematurity, which were appropriately managed by Dr Agrawal. The infant received total intravenous nutrition for 10 days through umbilical venous central line before he could tolerate sufficient feeding from the mouth. The baby was not given any antibiotics during the entire three-month hospital stay. Dr Agrawal said clinicians treating infants usually administer antibiotics fearing that they might lose the baby if the baby catches any infection. He advised against unnecessary use of antibiotics while crediting his entire team and neonatal nurses for ensuring strict compliance of Infection Control Practices. The baby was regularly monitored and finally discharged on November 13, 2021.

Neurosurgery team at Fortis Noida conducts life-saving emergency surgery on a 4-year-old COVID positive patient



The Neurosurgery Team at Fortis Noida set an example in living the Fortis value of Patient Centricity by conducting a life-saving emergency surgery without waiting for a 4-year-old patient's COVID test report. The child was brought to the Emergency on January 7, 2022, with complaints of drowsiness, breathing problems and dipping pulse. The child was found to have a large brain tumour that required immediate surgery. The child did not have any COVID symptoms when admitted, but as part of the extant protocol, his sample was sent for RT PCR.

Without waiting, the doctors conducted the emergency surgery since time was precious. It was decided by the Admin Team and the treating doctors that the child would be operated upon whilst following all the COVID protocols prescribed for an emergency surgery. Post operatively, he was kept in an isolated ICU. The COVID test report turned out to be positive. Even though Fortis Noida was not admitting any COVID positive patients then, the doctors had decided to carry out the surgery as shifting the child to a COVID hospital would have risked his life. He was discharged in good health on January 13, 2022.

First Swap kidney transplant at Fortis Escorts, New Delhi, performed

The first swap kidney transplant at Fortis Escorts, Okhla Road, New Delhi, was done on January 8, 2022, by team of Kidney and Urology experts led by Dr Sanjeev Gulati, Dr Anil Mandhani, Dr Ajit Singh Narula and Dr Anil Kumar Gulia. Both the patients, who are from different cities and have different blood groups, were advised kidney transplant. The doctors had considered the possibility of performing ABO incompatible transplant but decided otherwise in view of higher cost of plasmapheresis in them. Another concern was the high risk involved due to the use of very strong immunosuppressants amid the ongoing COVID situation. The patients underwent Live Donor Renal Allograft kidney transplant surgery with a swap of their respective donors. Both the patients are doing fine and have been discharged after one week.


Awareness skits and quiz contest mark National Organ Donation Day celebrations at Fortis Mohali

Double Delight: Fortis Mohali wins National Award for Excellence in Energy Management and State Energy Conservation Award





Tell us a bit about your family members

I was born and brought up in Ludhiana. Currently, I live with my parents, my wife and my two lovely daughters. I have three siblings, two elder sisters and one elder brother.

My father was into the business of manufacturing textiles. My mother was a home maker. My wife has done Masters in Art and has been a lecturer in Punjab University. My elder daughter is in primary school and my younger daughter will turn two this year.

How did you end up choosing the medical field?

My father always had a wish that his son should serve the society in some capacity. From my early school days itself, I was an inquisitive child. This urge to understand the logic behind everything drove me to explore basic things in our everyday life. Due to this, I also developed an interest in science and natural phenomena.

It was in later part of my school days, that we were asked to sit for an aptitude test. Based on the performance in that test, students were given an option to choose the science stream. I fared well in that aptitude test and consequently took biology as a subject in my eleventh standard.

Could you please share some details about your days in school or college?

I had some tough periods in my entire journey of becoming a doctor. Starting from my preparation days for the M.B.B.S examinations, I had to toil hard to get the desired seat in the prestigious Dayanand Medical College in Ludhiana. In my first attempt, I did not get a good rank. So, I shifted with my elder sister and took coaching from Bhatinda. I even recount one incident when the teacher had asked me to retake the examination in order to check my conceptual understanding.

Later, after my M.B.B.S, another period of struggle started after my name did not feature in the list of qualified candidates for M.D. I was deeply disappointed and heartbroken with the result, given the fact that all my colleagues had qualified. However, I did not give up and kept working hard.

I decided to shift to Delhi with my younger sister, where I started working in Sir Ganga Ram Hospital along with preparing for the D.N.B examination. In those days, apart from my professional life, the circumstances on the personal front were also quite challenging. Our financial condition was not that sound and my mother was diagnosed with cancer. This was a quite a nightmare for me as apart from doing well in my career, I also had the responsibility of my mother.

However, with God's grace and support from my family members, I was able to sail through both the challenges. I qualified in my D.N.B examination in the first attempt as well as got my mother treated in the same hospital successfully. I recount the preparation days in the hostel of Sir Ganga Ram Hospital where for good 4-5 months before my exam I would just take breaks for meals and a 6 hour sleep.

What are your hobbies?

I like to watch documentaries and TV series, and listen to music. I used to play sports in my early days.

How do you spend your free time?

Although, I rarely get free time but, whenever I do, I try to spend the maximum time with my family. I love spending precious moments with my daughters.




