Karnataka's first IORT system for breast cancer treatment launched at Fortis Cancer Institute, Bengaluru



Fortis Hospital, Bannerghatta Road, Bengaluru, installed an Intraoperative radiotherapy (IORT) system for the treatment of breast cancer in December 2021. An online press conference was conducted on February 3, 2022, ahead of World Cancer Day to announce the installation and completion of four cases using the IORT system. This is Karnataka's first IORT system for cancer care.

IORT is a single dose of radiation given to selected cancer patients (mostly at an early stage of cancer or low risk cancer) that reduces a 30 – 40 day radiation therapy to just 30 - 40 minutes. The team of doctors led by Dr Sandeep Nayak, Director - Surgical Oncology and Dr Nisha Vishnu, Consultant - Radiation Oncology at Fortis Cancer Institute, Bannerghatta Road, have already performed four IORT procedure on patients with early stage breast cancers from December 2021 to January 2022.

First In India: Pregnant woman fights blood cancer to deliver a healthy baby at Fortis, Gurugram

A team of super specialist doctors led by Dr Meet Pritamchand Kumar, Consultant, Haematology, Institute of Blood Disorder and Dr Deepti Asthana, Senior Consultant, Gynaecology, Fortis Memorial Research Institute (FMRI), Gurugram successfully delivered a baby in a medically challenging case of the mother suffering from Hodgkin's lymphoma and was carrying a baby whose growth was stagnant for a month with almost nil amniotic fluid.

She was started on chemotherapy during her second trimester of pregnancy. As per the available medical literature and published papers, this is the first such case in India and among very few cases worldwide wherein a mother being treated for hodgkin's lymphoma has successfully completed her pregnancy. In most similar cases, either the fetus does not survive or the baby passes away after birth. The patient had completed three cycles of chemotherapy before she delivered the healthy baby.

COVID positive patient undergoes emergency surgery at Fortis Rajajinagar, Bengaluru

A team of of surgeons including Dr B. S. Ramesh, Dr Ganesh Shenoy and Dr Sandeep and the Anaesthesia team led by Dr Naveen Gowda at Fortis Hospital, Rajajinagar, Bengaluru, successfully performed an emergency surgery on a 51-year-old COVID positive patient who was diagnosed with Diverticular Perforation. The patient had multiple comorbidities such as Diabetes Mellitus and Hypertension. She could not get admission elsewhere as she was COVID positive. She was immediately admitted in the earmarked COVID wing at Fortis Rajajinagar. With deranged blood metabolic parameters revealing acute kidney injury, the patient needed resuscitation and the same was done immediately to stabilise the patient. Without wasting time, our Anaesthesia and Surgical teams counselled the family members about the high risks involved and once the family gave the necessary consent and clearance, the patient was taken up for emergency laparoscopic surgery under General Anaesthesia. During the laparoscopic surgery, the doctors were surprised to find that she also had perforation in the stomach, caused due to COVID-related vasculitis, and large pelvic abscess caused due to Diverticular Perforation. The pus was removed and the perforations were closed.

The patient was managed well in the ICU, with the caregivers taking all the necessary precautions for COVID. The patient was started on feeds through jejunostomy on the third day after surgery. Treatment for COVID also continued. Repeat COVID RT PCR test done on the seventh post-operative day was negative. The patient tolerated diet and was stable at the time of discharge.



Doctors at Fortis Vasant Kunj remove live botfly larvae from 32-year-old US national's eyelid, neck and arms



A team of doctors comprising of Dr Mohammad Nadeem, Consultant and Head - Emergency, Dr Dheeraj, ER Physician, and Dr Narola Yangar from the Surgery Department at Fortis Flt Lt Rajan Dhall Hospital, Vasant Kunj, New Delhi, treated a rare case of Myiasis (larva or maggot inside human tissue) and removed three live botfly larvae from the right eyelid, neck and arm of a 32-year-old woman from the United States. The patient, who had a recent travel history to the Amazon, had arrived at Fortis Vasant Kunj on January 25, 2022, with complaints of swelling in the right upper eyelid along with redness and tenderness. She said that she felt something moving inside her eyelids once in a while for the past 4-6 weeks. She had consulted doctors in the United States but her condition did not improve.

Elaborating further, Dr Nadeem said, "It was a very rare case of Myiasis. The diagnosis was made on the basis of her travel history and visual evidence of movements inside her skin. Dr Yanger from the Surgery Department successfully removed three live botfly larvae, which were almost 2 cm in size. One was removed from the right upper eyelid, the second one from the back of her neck and the third one from her right forearm. The procedure was completed in 10-15 minutes with all precautions and without any anaesthesia. The patient was discharged soon after.

Botfly larvae are internal parasites of mammals, including humans. The larvae burrow into the tissue and feed on underlying structures. Such cases have been reported earlier from tropical and subtropical regions such as Central and South America and Africa. In India, such cases have been reported mostly in rural areas, particularly in children, where the botflies enter either through the nose or through skin lesions.

Neurosurgery team at Fortis Hospital, Jaipur successfully conducted 26 life-saving Emergency Surgeries in COVID positive patients



At a time when the whole country was struggling with the covid pandemic and there was a fear of the unknown, a disease that was so terrifying and new for everyone. In these times when patients and doctors alike did not have the confidence of good outcomes, the Fortis Escorts Neurosurgery team emerged strong and fearless.

When patients who needed immediate neurosurgery due to trauma or a tumour that could

not wait for the end of the covid wave or wait until they turned negative the neurosurgery team comprising of Dr Hemant Bhartiya, HOD & Director, Dept. of Neurosurgery, Dr Vivek Vaid, Additional Director, Neurosurgery, Dr Sankalp Bhartiya, Consultant, Neurosurgery and Dr Akshay Mangal, Associate Consultant, Neurosurgery, conducted 26 Emergency Major Neurosurgical procedures in COVID 19 positive patients during this pandemic. Fortis Escorts Hospital Jaipur is one of the most trusted names in healthcare in the private sector.

This pandemic did not spare anyone and a number of the healthcare workers have suffered from covid during either the first or second wave as did Dr Vivek Vaid and Dr Sankalp Bhartiya who tested positive and also needed admission. They carried on courageously after being declared negative.

All these surgeries took place during the period of crisis where all hospitals were struggling with shortage of resources, whether in terms of manpower or materials.



First at Fortis: Robot-assisted paediatric kidney transplant performed at Fortis BG Road, Bengaluru



Fortis Hospital, BG Road, Bengaluru, performed a Robot-assisted living donor kidney transplant on a 12-year-old girl child suffering from end-stage kidney failure. The team of doctors was led by Dr Mohan Keshavamurthy, Director - Urology, Uro-Oncology, Andrology, Uro-Gynaecology, Robotic Surgery & Transplantation and Dr Sreeharsha Harinatha from the Department of Urology, Uro-Oncology, Kidney Transplant and Robotic Surgery. A multi-disciplinary team of doctors including Dr Aashish Parekh, Consultant - Nephrology, Dr Yogesh Gupta, Consultant-Paediatrics and Dr Shivanand Patil, Consultant-Interventional Cardiology and the Anaesthesia team led by Dr Murali Chakravarthy Director, Anaesthesiology and Dr Ashok Anand, Consultant-Anaesthesiology were involved in treating the patient. This is the first case of Robot-assisted paediatric transplant in the Fortis network.

Dr Keshavamurthy explained, "The child was undergoing dialysis since a year and her condition was deteriorating. Owing to her critical condition, the mother decided to donate her kidney. We have performed a laparoscopic assisted donor nephrectomy and Da Vinci Xi Robot assisted Paediatric Renal Transplant recipient surgery. The child has recovered fully. She had come to the hospital on a wheelchair and returned home walking with infectious energy."

Emergency Caesarian surgery at Fortis Nagarbhavi, Bengaluru, saves 47-year-old COVID-19 positive patient's twins

A pregnant 47-year-old COVID positive woman, who also suffered from multiple complications, successfully underwent a complex emergency Lower Segment Caesarean Section (LSCS) surgery at Fortis Hospital, Nagarbhavi, Bengaluru on January 15, 2022. The surgery was necessitated as her amniotic sac had begun leaking. Despite a stormy pregnancy and a last-minute scare, the patient is now with her twins, thanks to the dedicated team effort put in by the OT Team, ICU Team, NICU Team, Physicians, Pulmonologists, the Obstetric Team and the hospital management.



The patient had conceived through IVF. It was a high risk pregnancy due to her advanced age. Additionally, she was found to have gestational diabetes at 28 weeks of gestation and developed high blood pressure at 30 weeks of gestation, requiring treatment with anti-hypertensives. She was admitted to the ICU at Fortis Nagarbhavi on January 13, 2022. She was closely monitored by the intensive care team, physician, pulmonologist, obstetrician and cardiologist, leading to symptomatic improvement.

A selective LSCS was planned at 34 weeks of gestation in view of the twin pregnancy. However, she was she found to be COVID positive during regular screening and was re-admitted to the ICU. On the fourth day of her ICU stay, the amniotic fluid began leaking. In view of twin gestation, a decision was taken to perform emergency LSCS (high risk category) immediately. The surgery went off well and she delivered twins, a boy weighing 1.2 kg and a girl weighing 1.7 kg. Both the babies were immediately shifted to NICU for pre-term care and the patient was shifted back to the ICU. The babies continued to stay in NICU under the able care of the neonatologist for 10 days and were discharged on January 29, 2022.

Western India's first Robotic Cruciate-retaining Knee Replacement Surgery performed at Hiranandani Hospital, Vashi-A Fortis Network Hospital

A team of Orthopaedic Specialists led by Dr Pramod Bhor, HOD - Orthopaedics at Hiranandani Hospital, Vashi-A Fortis Network Hospital, gave a new lease of life to a 72-year-old male patient from Navi Mumbai, by conducting a Robotic Cruciate-retaining Knee Replacement Surgery. This is Western India's first life enriching robotic surgery, which offered the patient rapid recovery and drastically reduced post-operative pain. The patient had been suffering from bilateral knee pain for seven years; with the right knee being more affected. The patient, a Yoga enthusiast, had age-related deformities in both knees, making daily activities like walking and performing specific Yoga postures difficult. The pain aggravated in the past 7-8 months, making knee movement difficult and painful for him. Hence under the expert's advice, he decided to go for the surgery.

The key benefits of robot-assisted orthopaedic surgery over conventional orthopedic techniques are enhanced precision and accuracy, more reproducible outcomes, and reliability. Less tissue damage, fewer cuts and reduced blood loss leading to diminished chances of infection are other advantages. In most surgeries, the Cruciate Ligaments are sacrificed, which can lead to extended post-operative hospitalisation. Explaining the procedure further, Dr Bhor said, "Cruciate-retaining surgery stabilises the joint better and gives a more natural feeling. This results in patients being able to move and walk much faster and go back to their daily lives with minimum complications. We have done the first Robotic Cruciate-Retaining Knee Replacement Surgery in Western India, which is a golden milestone in advanced orthopaedic care."



Non-Invasive Leadless Pacemakers implanted for the first time in Chennai at Fortis Malar

The Cardiac Sciences Team at Fortis Malar Hospital, Chennai, led by Dr Babu Ezhumalai, has successfully implanted the novel dual-chamber leadless permanent pacemaker through a non-surgical procedure in two elderly patients. These are the first reported cases of non-invasive Leadless Pacemaker implantation from Chennai.

One of the patients, a 60-year-old, was brought to Fortis Malar in a critical condition with heart attack and low heart rate. He was also suffering from renal failure, diabetes and hypertension, and was COVID positive at the time of admission. Since the patient was under dialysis and on blood thinners, the doctors had to identify a solution that would not affect his ongoing treatment. They opted for the dual-chamber leadless pacemaker that can be implanted non-invasively.

The second case was that of a 92-year-old man who presented with very low heart rate of 33 beats per minute and episodes of fainting. The implantation procedure lasted for approximately 30 minutes. He was discharged 24 hours after the procedure and is now able to carry out his daily tasks smoothly. In addition to dual chamber leadless pacemakers, many single chamber leadless pacemakers (Micra VR) have been implanted by Dr Babu Ezhumalai at Fortis Malar Hospital since 2019. The youngest person to undergo a single chamber leadless permanent pacemaker procedure was a 31-year-old woman with complex congenital heart disease.






