# Fortis Healthcare launches Fortis Institute of Blood Disorders for specialised treatment of blood cancers and related disorders







The Fortis Institute of Blood Disorders was inaugurated at a well-attended event held at Fortis Memorial Research Institute, Gurugram, on January 5, 2024. Dr A. Raghuvanshi, MD & CEO and Mr Anil Vinayak, Group COO were among the senior leaders present on the occasion. The advanced facility, led by Dr Rahul Bhargava, Principal Director & Chief - Bone Marrow Transplant, is a dedicated centre for the specialised treatment of blood cancers and disorders. The Institute fills a critical gap in addressing the urgent need for a comprehensive institute focusing on the diverse spectrum of blood disorders, integrating paediatric and geriatric care, advanced transplant procedures and hematopathology expertise.

The Institute also introduced the revolutionary CAR-T cell therapy, NexCAR19<sup>™</sup> (Actalycabtagene autoleucel), to its extensive network of Bone Marrow Transplant centres in Mohali, Delhi, Gurgaon, Noida, Mumbai and Bangalore. The initiative was supported by a commercial collaboration with ImmunoACT, an IIT-Bombay spin-off and pioneer in India's first fully indigenous and commercially approved gene-modified cell therapy. NexCAR19<sup>™</sup>, India's first market authorized CAR-T cell therapy, offers a new ray of hope for treating B-cell lymphomas and B-acute lymphoblastic leukaemia in patients aged 15 and above, who have previously found limited success with other treatments.

### Fortis Hospital Mohali acquires most advanced Elekta Versa HD with SGRT for cancer treatment



Fortis Hospital Mohali has acquired the most technically advanced Elekta Versa HD with SGRT to attain greater precision in cancer care. The state-of-the-art radiotherapy treatment will revolutionise cancer treatment with its advanced capabilities and offers unparalleled opportunity for both precision Radiation Therapy and Surface Guided Radiation Therapy (SGRT) with SRS cones as a non-invasive alternative for small tumours like Brain Mets, AVM, Trigeminal Neuralgia, Acoustic Neuroma, Pituitary Adenomas &

Movement Disorders. Besides this, other standard radiation delivery options like intensity modulation under image guidance and volumetric arc therapy are also offered. Dr Narendra Kumar Bhalla, Director, Radiation Oncology informed that Elekta Versa HD precisely targeted cancer cells, while minimizing the impact on healthy tissues with personalised treatment plans. It also offers stereotactic radiation therapy as a non-invasive alternative for small tumours. The surface guidance also aids Deep Inspiratory Breath Hold (DIBH) Technique for Breast Cancer by temporarily moving critical organs away from the breast during radiation, minimizing exposure and improving treatment efficacy.

The clinic aims to provide personalised cancer treatment, tailored according to the specific requirements of each patient. To spread awareness about the clinic, FCI-VK has arranged for a mobile mammography van that visits residential areas in Vasant Kunj and Vasant Vihar, New Delhi. The van visits a different location each day and pre-registered women get their mammography done, followed by an evaluation by an Oncologist. Other than mammography, in the mobile van also offers regular health check-up such as BP, weight, blood sugar, Peak Flow Meter test to evaluate lung capacity and consultation with general physicians, ophthalmologists and dentists. The activity will continue throughout February.

### 31-year-old's eye cancer treated at Fortis Memorial, Gurugram, with Made-in-India Plaque



A 31-year-old female foreign patient successfully underwent Plaque Brachytherapy to treat her eye cancer at Fortis Memorial Research Institute, Gurugram. The patient, suffering from a challenging choroidal melanoma affecting her eye, was treated using an indigenously produced Plaque (Ruthenium 106) made by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Mumbai, which is available at a fraction of the cost compared to the imported one.

The plaque insertion was done on November 3, 2023, by Dr Anita Sethi, Director & HOD - Ophthalmology, assisted by Dr Neeraj Sanduja, Senior Consultant - Ophthalmology, with support from Dr Amal Roy Choudhary, Director - Radiation Oncology and the Radiation Oncology Team. "The case was challenging as the tumour was very close to the Optic Nerve and we needed to limit the radiation dose to protect the Optic Nerve and other sensitive tissue," said Dr Sethi. The plaque was removed three days later. The patient is doing well after the procedure and vision improvement was observed within the first few days.

# First in India: Device to prevent sudden cardiac death implanted on 79-year-old at Fortis Jaipur

A team of doctors led by Dr Amit Kumar Singhal, Additional Director & Senior Consultant - Cardiology, at Fortis Escorts Hospital, Jaipur, has performed the first Automatic Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator (AICD) implantation procedure in India. The device is capable of preventing sudden cardiac death (SCD) due to irregular rhythm of a patient's heart beat (Ventricular Tachyarrythmias).

The device was implanted in a 79-year-old male patient, who had been brought to the Emergency on February 1, 2024, with complaints of giddiness. Tests revealed that the patient had Polymorphic Ventricular Tachycardia, a potentially life threatening arrythmia that could lead to cardiac arrest or SCD. The patient was stabilised with anti-arrythmic drugs and admitted in Critical Cardiac Care Unit for thorough monitoring. As per protocol, AICD device was implanted for secondary prevention of SCD from Ventricular Tachyarrythmias. The implanted device is one of the most advance AICDs, which was launched last year. In addition to all advanced features at par with other devices, such as 3 Tesla MRI compatibility, it



imbibes unique algorithms, including six parameters to assess heart failure and apnea early (precursors of arrythmia), thus prompting for early intervention (arrythmia prevention). The device also has a long life. The patient tolerated the procedure well and was discharged on February 7.

# 42-year-old male suffering from 'white lung' treated at Fortis Escorts, Okhla with ECMO therapy



Fortis Escorts, Okhla, New Delhi achieved a remarkable feat by successfully treating a critically ill 42-year-old male from Agra with white lung (severe lung infection, wherein the lung shows up as a white patch on an X-ray image) using Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO). Facing severe breathing issues, fever and coughing with sputum, the patient tested positive for H1N1 and Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS). Despite initial interventions like high-flow nasal cannula and ventilator support, the patient's oxygen saturation remained dangerously low, prompting the medical team to implement Veno-venous ECMO, ultimately proving to be a life-saving measure. Under the care of Dr Avi Kumar, Senior Consultant - Pulmonology and Dr Rajat Agarwal, Director - Critical Care, the patient's health gradually improved during the two-week critical care period, and he was discharged in stable condition after a 35-day stay on December 1, 2023, avoiding the need for a lung transplant.

# Team International Patient Services at Fortis Memorial, Gurugram, celebrates spirit of 'Caring for the Cancer Caregivers'





#### **Digital Marketing Accelerator Programme for Fortis Healthcare Limited**




