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


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
World Antibiotics Awareness Week observed at Fortis Hospital, Mohali

A Little Extra Care

Fortis Mulund's medical relief team treats over 2,000 patients in the flood-affected areas of Kolhapur, Maharashtra

A medical aid team led by Dr Sandeep Gore, HOD-Emergency Medicine, Fortis Hospital, Mulund, treated more than 2,000 flood-affected patients as part of an emergency medical relief operation conducted in Kolhapur, Maharashtra. The relief drive was initiated and coordinated by the Community Connect Team led by Dr Ashutosh Pandey, Head-Community Connect and Emerging Business, Fortis Mulund. The team included doctors and volunteers from the Fortis hospitals in Mulund and Kalyan apart from the Lions Club, Bhandup, and Matoshree Sevadham Arogya Seva Trust (MAST). The team visited flood-affected areas across Shirol Taluka, covering several villages.

Patients were treated for gastroinstestinal aliments, leptospirosis infection, fever, malaria and skin infections. The team carried anti-venom and anti-rabies medications, and dispensed water purification tablets, first aid kits to the people in the affected areas. Funds collected from within the Fortis Group of Hospitals in Mumbai, helped in the procurement of medical supplies. Citizens of Mumbai opened their hearts to this cause and helped collect food and sanitary supplies. The relief aid team distributed 5,000 sanitary napkin boxes, 3,000 liters of water, 2,000 kg wheat flour, 2,000 kg rice, 700 kg toor dal, 2,000 kg sugar, 500 kg washing powder, 2000 kg Dichloro diphenyl trichloroethane (DDT) powder, apart from thousands of packets of snacks, 20,000 blankets and 5,000 toothbrushes and toothpastes.

Speaking about the initiative, Dr Gore said, "Mr Samir Shingte, Deputy Collector, Shirol, Kolhapur, and Mr Pundalik Jadhav Chief – MAST, helped us immensely, enabling us to reach remote areas. Having faced incessant rains for days together, most people from the area were extremely susceptible to infections, especially children and the elderly. The locals helped us set up camps. I would like to thank the local authorities in Shirol and to Mumbaikars for helping us with the relief material and to my team who worked round the clock to care for the patients."


