



### **New Beginnings & Launches**

### Fortis launches state-of-the-art 200 bedded multi-speciality hospital in Greater Noida





In keeping with its vision of becoming the world's most trusted healthcare network, Fortis Healthcare launched its state-of-the-art hospital in Greater Noida on October 3, 2022. ### Fortis Hospital, Mulund, organises scientific session as part of the launch of 'Fortis Institute of Blood Disorders'





## World's largest floating loose body removed from knee joint of 77-year-old, at Fortis Escorts, Okhla, New Delhi







In a rare feat, doctors at Fortis Escorts, Okhla, New Delhi, removed the world's largest floating loose body from knee joint of a 77-year-old patient on July 26, 2022. The team of doctors led by Dr Kaushal Kant Mishra, Director-Orthopaedics & Joint Replacement, Fortis Escorts, Okhla, New Delhi performed the surgery—a one-of-its-kind case.

The patient, himself a doctor from Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, had difficulty in walking and had extreme pain in the knee for the last 15 years, which had increased over the last five years. After the evaluation of the patient, the doctors concluded that he had Osteoarthritis of the knee and was suffering from a loose body floating in the knee joint for the last 35-40 years. Dr Mishra then suggested a total knee replacement and removing the floating loose body from the knee. Loose bodies of the size of up to 2 cm is fairly common among the elderly. The largest known loose body size as per medical literature PubMed is approx. 5x2x1 cm but in this case, it was several times larger than the size of the knee cap, measuring 10x9.5x3 cm, making it the world's largest floating loose body from the knee joint. The size of the extracted loose body was almost 60 to 70% of the knee, weighing 400 gm approx. The cartilage of the loose body can further be used for cartilage transplant and bone grafts too.

Dr Mishra took out the loose body in less than five minutes and total procedure of the knee replacement was done in 50 minutes. After performing the procedure, the patient started walking within two hours. "If the loose body is small and not treated on time, it may lead to the damage of knees. But this being the largest loose body, the patient was already unable to walk which has already led to knee damage," said Dr Mishra.



## Doctors at Fortis Escorts, Faridabad, save life and voice of 28-year-old kite string injury victim



A team of doctors at Fortis Escorts Hospital, Faridabad, gave a new lease of life to a 28-year-old salesman who had suffered a deep wound on his neck, caused by a kite string. The patient was bleeding profusely when he was brought to the hospital's Emergency on July 11, 2022. The sharp string had caused a 20 cm long incision, injuring

several major blood vessels and the voice box (larynx).

After controlling the bleeding, the patient was shifted to the ICU, where the airway was immediately secured by video laryngoscopy. The patient was then shifted to the Operation Theatre for a lifesaving emergency surgery. A team led by Dr Manu Shankar, Director - General Surgery and Dr Nitin Sardana, Senior Consultant - General Surgery carefully secured the bleeding vessels and repaired the wounds. Post surgery, the patient was shifted to the ICU and put on ventilator. He was placed under the care of Dr Supradip Ghosh, Director & Head - Critical Care Medicine and Dr Amandeep Singh, Senior Consultant - Critical Care Medicine, and was monitored constantly. The patient was successfully extubated on July 15, 2022, with a preserved voice.

## 104-year-old man's hip fracture successfully treated through Complex Primary Revision Hip Replacement Surgery at Fortis Anandapur, Kolkata

Sixty minutes was all that a team of surgeons at Fortis Hospital, Anandapur, had to perform a complex primary revision hip replacement surgery on a 104-year-old farmer from Midnapore, West Bengal. The case was extremely challenging as the centenarian, a known case of osteoporosis, also suffered from multiple co-



morbidities including hypertension, heart and lung ailments. As an extended dose of anaesthesia could have affected the patient adversely, the doctors had to perform the surgery within the short span. The team of doctors was led by Dr Anindansu Basu, Orthopaedic Surgeon.

The patient had met with an accident while returning from his farms, causing a hip fracture. His family had taken him to the Midnapore outreach OPD of Fortis Anandapur after local doctors and hospitals refused to treat him owing to his advanced age and health complications. He was advised hip replacement surgery. His family was initially reluctant but eventually realised that surgery was the only possible option as a plaster could not have helped heal the serious injury. They brought the patient to Fortis Anandapur, where a multi-disciplinary team comprising of cardiac specialists, endocrinologists, lung specialists, intensivists and anaesthetists, thoroughly evaluated the patient and planned the surgery in meticulous detail. The doctors opted for a Long Stem Cemented Bipolar Surgery to fix the fracture. The patient recovered relatively quickly and was discharged on May 27, 2022, after 10 days of admission.

#### Rare case of Adult Congenital Bochdalek Diaphragmatic Hernia treated laparoscopically at Fortis Escorts, New Delhi





A team of doctors at Fortis Escorts, New Delhi, led by Dr Vivek Vij, Chairman - Liver Transplant and GI Surgery, Dr Sanjay Verma, Director – Minimal Access, Bariatric & GI Surgery, conducted a minimally invasive procedure to treat a rare congenital condition – Bochdalek Diaphragmatic Hernia – of a 39-year-old female patient.

The patient had presented with a complaint of fever and shortness of breath. Her problem came to light after her symptoms aggravated during a

vacation at a hill station. During evaluation, she was diagnosed to have Congenital Bochdalek Diaphragmatic Hernia with atelectasis (collapse) of the left lung. Bochdalek Hernia (BH) in adults is extremely rare. Her stomach, small intestine, spleen and colon had herniated into the chest, impairing her ability to breathe. She underwent a Laparoscopic Diaphragmatic Hernia Repair on June 30, 2022. The abdominal organs, which had occupied the chest, were moved back to the abdominal cavity and the hole in the diaphragm was closed and reinforced by using a mesh. The patient has recovered well after the procedure.

### Doctors at Fortis hospitals in Bengaluru use Impella device to support angioplasties of senior citizens



In a span of 30 days, doctors at Fortis hospitals in Bengaluru used the Impella Heart Pump to treat three elderly patients suffering from 'failing heart' and conducted complex angioplasties with the assistance of the supportive device. This was announced at an event on August 30, 2022. While Dr Keshava R, Director - Interventional Cardiology, Fortis Hospital, Cunningham Road, treated an 81-year-old male patient, Dr Srinivas Prasad, Consultant - Interventional Cardiology, Fortis Hospital, Bannerghatta Road, treated a 71-year-old female patient. Dr Gopi A., Director - Interventional Cardiology and Dr Sridhara R., Associate Director - Interventional Cardiology, Fortis Hospital, Cunningham Road, successfully performed the procedure on an 85-year-old patient.

All the three elderly patients had undergone angioplasty a few years ago and were again diagnosed with multiple heart blockages. Considering the advanced age, the doctors opted for the Impella device to support the procedure. Impella is a small heart pump used to support the heart during the procedure and is a boon for patients who have a low heart function. It can also be used to support the heart in cases of high-risk angioplasties (Protected PCI) in patients with poor heart function.

These cards contain the exact tasks of each card holder in the event of an emergency and is assigned at the beginning of each shift. The assigned responsibilities comply with the AHA ACLS Guidelines and this helps coordinate and manage an emergency with utmost efficiency while complying with the established protocols."

#### "A Stich in Time" (RRT)

Mr Sharma 50 Years old patient admitted in the hospital with c/o pain in lower limbs and difficulty in walking since six months and the known case of HTN, DM.

Patient was undergone for radiological investigation and diagnosed with osteoarthritis and for the same patients was undergone for B/L Knee Replacement. And shifted ICU on POD-0 and on POD -1 patient was shifted to B1 Ward in stable condition.

On POD-1 The assign staff went to patient room around 3pm for hourly nursing rounds and she has found patient showing symptoms of Sweating, palpitation, Dizziness & Headache and immediately she has checked RBS and that was 40mg/dl, so it was the ideal situation to meet the criteria of Modified Early Warning Sign. Therefore, assign staff announce the RRT straight wat by dialling the Number 8888 through PA System.

Meanwhile Ward Nurse has checked the patient Vitals parameter (BP-80/50 mm of hg, HR-120 beat/Minute, R-25 breath/minute, Spo2-92%)

Within 3minutes all RRT Members have arrived on the Spot. Ward Doctor has advised to administer 25% dextrose of 100ml bolus.

ICU Nurse has attached the ECG Electrode to monitor patient Vitals, Spo2 as well as cardiac rhythm.

CCM Doctor has quickly assessed and the review the patient condition and advised to give 300ml NS bolus in view hypotension.

Nursing supervisor has made every necessary arrangement for RRT Team to handle the situation smoothly as well as Nursing Supervisor was documented the events.

After 15 minutes of event ward nurse has again Checked RBS which was 100 mg/dl and the Vitals of the patient was within Normal Limits (BP- 110/70 mm of hg, HR-80BPM, R-20 Breath per Minute, Spo2-97%).

#### **DEBRIEFING OF THE EVENTS**

#### **Praising Points**

- By Ward Staff Nurse early recognition of symptoms of hypoglycaemia was identified on time and promptly activated the RRT with loud and clear voice through PA System.
- All the RRT Member was on time with in the time frame of HCO.
- RRT Situation was smoothly and effectively handled at the ward itself.

#### **Take Away Points**

- Patient intake of food was inadequate after receiving the Insulin therapy. So, Assign staff has to emphasized on quantity consumed/intake of food by patient and same has to convey endocrinologist/ Primary Physician.
- Insulin therapy has to modified as per the sliding scale as well as the patient consumption/intake of food.

#### **Follow UP**

After 2-4 hours of RRT visit Patient Vitals as well as the RBS was within the Normal range (RBS- 110mg/dl, BP-120/70 mm of hg, HR- 76 BPM, R-16 Breath per minute)

After 12-24 hours of RRT visit Patient Vitals as well as the RBS was within the Normal range (RBS- 114mg/dl, BP- 120/80 mm of hg, HR- 80 BPM, R-20 Breath per minute)

Next Day patient was happily discharge from the Hospital without any further hypoglycaemic episode and while endorsement of discharge summary to patient family, exclusively health education given to strict of blood sugar level as well as how to tackle hypoglycaemic events.

#### **RRT (RAPID RESPONSETEAM)**

The Hospital Rapid Response Team is a multidisciplinary Team which is available 24x7 and will respond within 3-5 Minutes to the notification of Modified early warning sign of deterioration of any adult/Pediatric in patient in FHVK.



- 3. Heart Rate <50 or >130 Beats Per Minute.
- 4. Systolic BP <70 0r > 180 mm of Hg.
- 5. RR <8 or >30 Breath Per Minute
- 6. Temperature <35° Or >38.6°
- Blood Sugar <80 mg/dl with Hypoglycaemic Symptom or <60 mg/dl with No Hypoglycaemic Symptom.
- 8. New Onset of Chest Pain with Sweating in Non-Cardiac Patient
- 9. Hourly Urine Output <30ml/hr. for consequently 3hours and in 3hours Total Urine Output <100ml.
- 10. Acute Onset of Neurological Symptoms
  - a. Acute Mental Status Change

- b. Unexplained Onset of Lethargy and/or Agitation
- c. Seizure
- 11. Symptoms of Stroke:
  - a. Sudden Loss or Change in Speech
  - b. Sudden Loss of Movement (Weakness) of face, Arms or Legs.
  - c. Numbness and Tingling
  - d. Dip in Level of consciousness
- 12. Major Bleeding
- 13. Sudden dislodgment of tubes (Chest, Tracheal)

#### Fortis Hospital, Ludhiana, wins first prize at Nurses Neonatology Quiz









Entrostomal therapists are specially trained to manage various types of stoma (a surgically created opening in the body) challenges, such as retracted stoma, prolapse stoma, peristomal hernia and ulcerated peristomal skin stoma. Stoma, which is created particularly for colon cancer, bladder cancer, CA rectum, and neurogenic bladder as a lifesaving surgery requires

special attention for its management and care. Ms Chaitali demonstrated pre-operative and post-operative care of patients with various types of stoma. She explained details of stoma marking and spoke about how to manage colostomy and urostomy pouch or bag. She also shared baseplate changing techniques and spoke about how to manage psychosocial trauma of patients and social taboo, among other things.

variety of options and variations in ailments. The surgical field from base of skull to the toes makes it a huge area for innovation and brings a wide variety to the surgical field.

I lecture extensively, doing close to 35 workshops/ lectures, which unfortunately means most weekends go in academic activities, preparing for these talks or travelling which is definitely educationally good but also fairly time consuming. #### What are some of the path breaking work your team has done?

Our team is fairly innovative and our department stands out for its novel ideas. We are pioneers for Pain free knee replacements, Short stay knee replacements, Same day mobilization after joint replacements, No blood transfusion knee replacements. We have been doing Navigation assisted knee replacements for a while. We have our own Bone banking program.

We have developed our own methodology of limb lengthening over nails and are a referral unit for prosthetic joint infection.

#### What do you think of the future of Medicine and Orthopaedics in our country?

The complete care of Orthopaedics does involve a team getting together and surgeons working as a unit. Continuously evolving techniques and updating your skills with an environment which fosters excellence is the way forward. An open attitude to criticism, learning from mistakes and seeking help when required.

#### Tell us about your Awards and achievements


